Liturgy of the Palms: Please gather in the hall

Blessed be God:

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit:

And blessed be God's kingdom, now and for ever. Amen.

Dear friends in Christ, in our observance of Lent we have been preparing, by self-examination and spiritual discipline, to celebrate the mystery of our Lord's death and resurrection. In baptism we are marked with the cross of Christ. Today we begin the solemn celebration of our salvation through his death on the cross and his resurrection to glory. We now recall our Lord's entry as king into Jerusalem, to suffer, to die, and to rise again. Let us follow him, that, as we died with Christ in our Baptism, so we may share his risen life.

Assist us Lord God of our salvation:

that we may enter with joy

into the celebration of those mighty acts whereby you give us life and immortality;

through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

one God, world without end. Amen.

Give thanks to the Lord for his glorious Gospel.

Praise to Christ our Lord.

Blessing of Palms:

Almighty and everlasting God, may these palms be for us

a sign of Christ's victory over sin and death; and may we who have been baptised in his name,

worship him as king, obey him as Lord, and follow him in the way of the Cross,

which leads to eternal life.

We ask this through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Collect:

Almighty God,

whose most dear Son went not up to joy,

but first he suffered pain,

and entered not into glory before he was crucified:

mercifully grant, that we, walking in the way of his cross,

may find it none other than the way of life and peace; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord. **Amen**.
